## CHINESE AUCTION

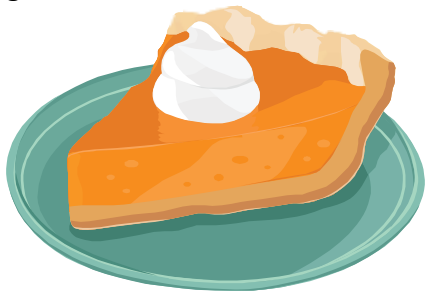

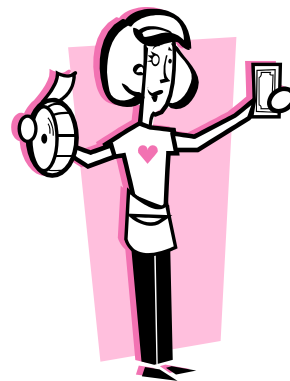
