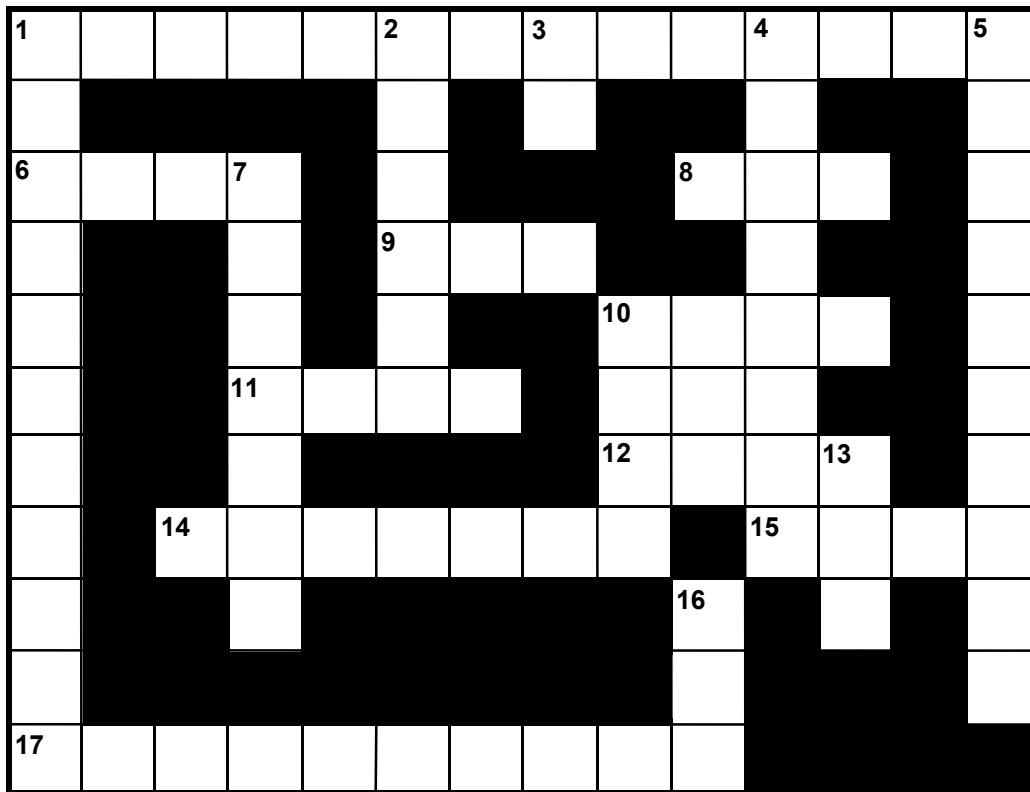

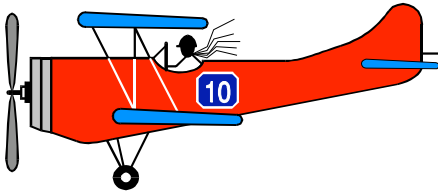

Christine Bernet: October Quilter of the Month

I have no idea why I wanted to start quilting. I learned to sew when I was ten and made most of my clothes from middle school through college. When I was 25 I made my brother a "quilt" for Christmas. I had no clue what I was doing. I put two sheets together with some fat batting between the two and outline quilted his initials in the center in 2-foot tall letters. I think I channel quilted the rest of the "quilt." He LOVED it and, in fact, still has it. The next year, I made my sister a "scenic quilt." It consisted of huge slabs of solid-colored fabric put together to look like a mountain and sun and who-knows-what. It didn't hold up well and a few years later I caught her sneaking the quilt into my other sister's house to be used as a dog bed.

Then I had kids, went to grad school and was too busy to do any crafts. Quilts kept pulling at me and I told myself that when I completed my studies, I would treat myself to learning to quilt. I took Kathy Green's classes and learned a lot about what I had been doing wrong. Patti Brown's son and my son attended the same high school and became friends. One day the topic of quilting came up and Andy piped up with, "My mom quilts." WELL. After seeing Patti's quilting studio, I realized that I was not yet a "quilter." I think my husband was learning to regret the day I walked into her fabric and gadget-filled room.

Patti introduced me to guild life (Seaside), quilt shows (Houston, PIQF, Road), and retreats. Now Scott is really sorry I stepped into Patti's room that day.

My quilts tend toward traditional piecing but I am trying to let myself be freer with my designs. To meet that goal, I have taken two classes; Patricia Klem at Visions and one through Quilt University. Both classes have been an emotional ride for me. I have realized how tough it is for me to learn to believe I have artistic instincts and to let myself go with them.

I have been married to a wonderfully supportive man for almost 25 years. We have two sons; one studying in Taiwan and the other is at UCLA. My husband is an architect and I am a psychologist. Our offices are in a home near downtown that we share. It works for us because we get to eat lunch together almost every day and are each completely unable to comment on the other's business.



Sharyn Craig: Program Speaker for October

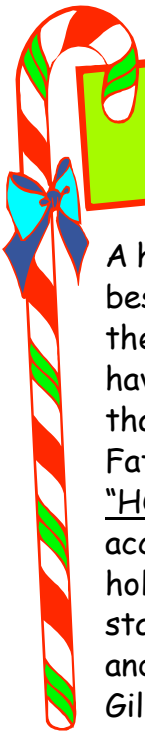
Hello Seaside Quilters, it is the Program co-whatever, piping up from the corner!!!

Seaside Challenge: The View From My Window

HEY - ALL SEASIDE CHALLENGE QUILTERS

Now is the time to put your thinking cap on and get ready for the annual Challenge.

This year it will be a 2 for 1. In addition to the challenge, the blocks you make will be used for our 2008/2009 Opportunity Quilt. Wha a great way to do something fun and help the guild at the same time. The theme this year is:

THE VIEW FROM MY WINDOW

The rules are simple:

Take a photo out your window. Make a block no smaller than 6x6 or larger than 18x18 or any dimension of 6 within. i.e. 6x18, 12x18, 18x18, 12x12 (you get the idea. Couldn't be simpler, just don't forget this is a finished size. It needs to be 1/2" larger to incorporate into the Opportunity quilt. The blocks will be judged on likeness to the photo you took from your window and interpretation into a block.

The finished blocks will be made into a quilt to be used for our Opportunity Quilt 2008-2009. There is no fabric provided. The assembled quilt will have a complementary fabric to make all of the blocks work. Since we all live in similar geographic areas, it will be a challenge to make YOUR block unique to YOUR view. Only views from your residence window allowed.

Signups are at the October Meeting. Have your \$5 ready and some good creative ideas. It will be interesting to see all the different ways we see the view from our window.

Finished blocks need to be turned in in April, 2008.

Seaside Quilt Guild Block of the Month for October 2007

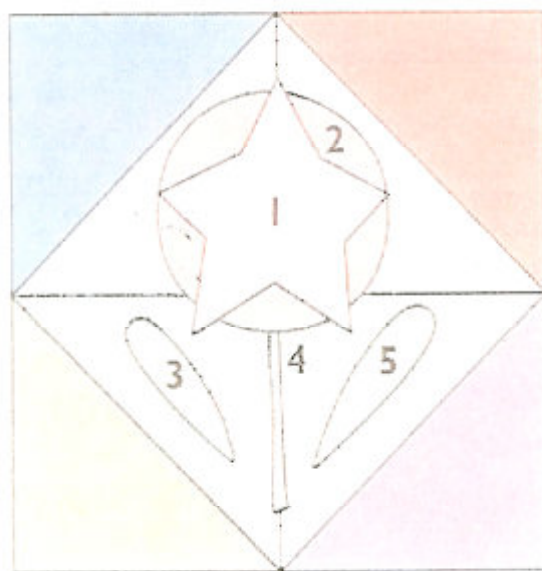
STARFLOWERS

(from *Flowering Quilts* by Kim Schaefer)

Block size: 8" x 8"

Fabrics: Assorted lights and darks, greens for stems and leaves

Each block has a button (to be sewn on after quilting)
which will be won by the winner of the blocks!

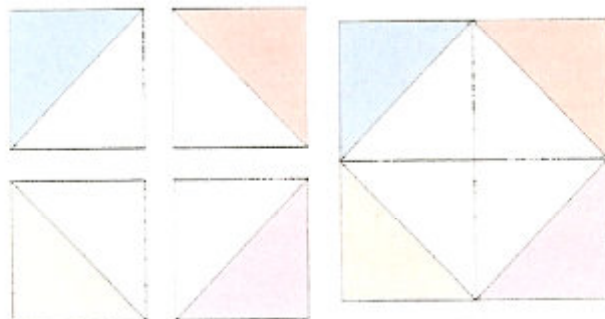


Cut squares: 4 $7/8$ " x $7/8$ " from assorted lights for the background

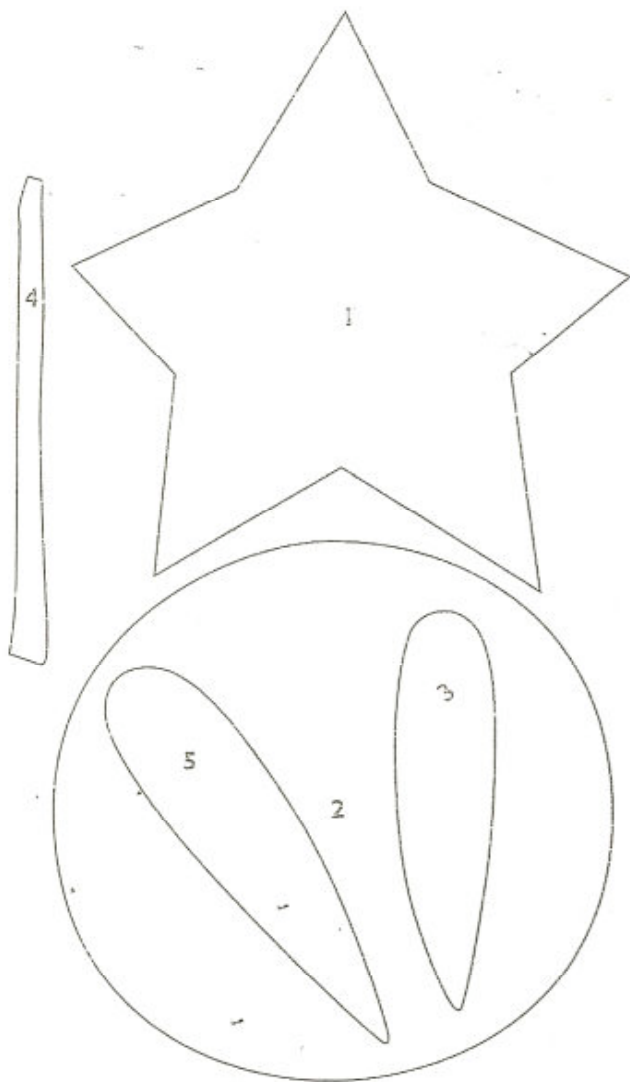
Cut squares: 4 $7/8$ " x $7/8$ " from assorted darks for the background

Cut the squares on the diagonal. Sew the light triangle to the dark triangles on the diagonal edge.

See diagram below. Sew the background blocks. Finished size 8" x 8"

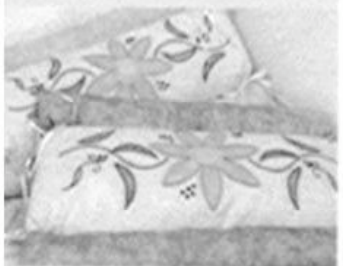
